In retirement David was trustee then temporary chief executive of Warning Zone the only children safety centre in the East Midlands. A former Ambassador for Giving World Online David became trustee of LOROS in 2009 and is also a life member of the Friends of University of Leicester Botanic Garden. He is currently a volunteer with the Leicestershire and Rutland Wildlife Trust, trustee and volunteer of the Bradgate Park Trust with a particular passion for drystone walling!

David is currently in his second term as the Independent Person Leicester, dealing with complaints about the alleged conduct of councillors.

David was awarded the Queens Police Medal in 2002 for distinguished service and in 2015 was commissioned Deputy Lieutenant for Leicestershire.
