



Rory Underwood MBE DL

Rory Underwood was educated at Barnard Castle School, followed by initial officer training at RAF College Cranwell. Rory is an English former rugby union player and is England's record international try scorer with 49 tries in 85 internationals between 1984 and 1996.

He played for England in the Rugby World Cups of 1987, 1991 and 1995, and he played 236 games for Leicester Tigers between 1983 and 1997. He toured with the British and Irish Lions in 1989 and 1993 playing in six tests and scoring one try. Rory was awarded the MBE for services to Rugby in 1995.



Playing during the amateur era Rory's profession was as a Royal Air Force pilot. He served with the RAF until 2001 and now runs his own management consultancy business.
