Henrietta Chubb is a lifelong resident of Leicestershire.

Henrietta served as High Sheriff of Leicestershire in 2023/24. In addition to raising money for her chosen charities, she also established the Leicestershire High Sheriffs Fund, raising over £75,000 for the fund as a legacy for future High Sheriffs to distribute income from the fund to charities in Leicester and Leicestershire.

Henrietta graduated from Newcastle with a BSc (Hons) Applied Consumer Sciences and later completed an MSc in Conservation Science at De Montfort University.

In 2007, she became a magistrate and now serves on the adult and youth crime benches, Crown Court appeals, and the Lord Chancellor's Advisory Committee.

Henrietta, a member of the Worshipful Company of Grocers, was elected to the Court of the Grocers Company in 2018, making her one of the first two women to do so in its 600-year history. She chairs the Grocers' Education Sub-committee and sits on the Grocers

Education and Charities Committee. Additionally, she is on the steering group for No Going Back, a Livery Company initiative supporting people from prison into employment.

Henrietta is a Trustee of the University of Evansville, Indiana, USA, and of Harlaxton College, the University's study abroad campus in Grantham, Lincolnshire. She chairs the College's Advisory Council and received the Samuel Orr Honorary Alumna Award from the University of Evansville Alumni Association in 2023.

Henrietta is Patron of CleanupUK, a litter picking charity, and is President of the South West Leicestershire Scouts, and Trustee of Reaching People Charity. She is a member of the Melton Friends of Rainbows Children's and Young Persons Hospice, Loughborough. Previously, she chaired her local parish council for 20 years and was a Trustee of CleanupUK.

She is married to David, and they have grown-up twins, Harry and Libby. Henrietta enjoys walking her dogs and the company of her friends.
